Frege's Influence

- 'Mathematics is reducible to logic alone'
- Russell's paradox

– Basic Law V is inconsistent

- "the sole possible foundations of arithmetic seem to vanish" (Frege)
- Russell takes up the mantle of Logicism

The Theory of Types



- Hierarchical definition
 - People (individuals) are
 type 0
 - Teams (classes of individuals) are type 1
 - Leagues (classes of type 1 classes) are type 2
 - And so on

Defining Numbers

- natural numbers are classes of classes
 '1' is the class of all type 1 classes of exactly one individual
- integers are relations on natural numbers
- rational numbers are ratios of integers
- real numbers are classes of rational numbers
- complex numbers are ordered pairs of real numbers

Unfortunately Necessary

• Axiom of Infinity

– There are infinitely many individuals

• Axiom of Reducibility

- Every class is equivalent to a predicative class

• Axiom of Choice

 For any collection of distinct non-empty classes, there is a class containing exactly one member from each class in the collection

On Postulating



The method of "postulating" what we want has many advantages; they are the same as the advantages of theft over honest toil.
